**His Mercy Endures Forever  
Fr. Stephen Kenyon**

One week ago we celebrated the greatest day of the year - Easter Sunday, the day our Lord Jesus Christ rose from the dead, freeing us from the sting of death and leading us to eternal life. After the long journey of Lent, remembering the cross and all He suffered for us, we finally come to the empty tomb and we see the Risen Lord standing before our eyes.

But what does it all mean? This is not just an event that happened to Jesus, it is an event that includes us. I think maybe one of the most powerful ways to see this is witnessing when people enter the Church at the Easter Vigil. On the night in which we remember Christ rising from the dead, those who have been preparing all year (and sometimes longer) through RCIA now receive the sacraments of new life: Baptism, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion. His new life means our new life. His resurrection includes us. The old has gone, the new has come.

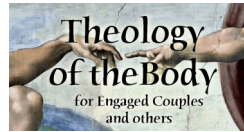
This is such an amazing mystery that today we get to sit back, a week later after the Resurrection, and ponder this mystery and what it means for us. And so today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, a day to reflect on the mystery of the Lord's mercy. Because really the word "mercy" sums up everything He did for us, from the incarnation to the cross to the empty tomb, it was all about mercy. Mercy means that although we deserve punishment for our sins - we deserve hell - God stepped in and forgave us. He gave us a forgiveness we did not deserve to save us from a punishment that we did deserve. And He did it even though it cost Him the cross. Mercy means second chances and new beginnings. It means that it is no longer our sins that define us, it is now His infinite love and our new identity in Christ that tell us who we are. Once we were lost, now because of His mercy we are found. Once we were dead in our sins, now we have eternal life. That is what our new Catholic brothers and sisters experienced last Saturday at the Easter Vigil when they received the sacraments: His mercy giving them a new beginning. And it is a reminder to all of us of what Easter is really about: His Divine Mercy. The Psalms put it best, "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His mercy endures forever" (Psalm 136:1).

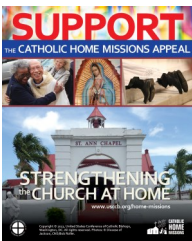

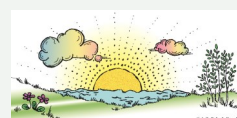

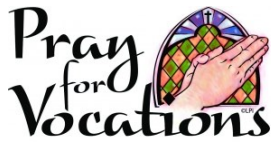

**CELEBRATING THE SAINTS**



**ST CATHERINE OF SIENA (1347 - 1380)**, born in Siena, Italy, entered the Dominican Third Order at 18. When she was 21 she had an experience she described as her “mystical marriage to Christ.” She often visited the sick and the poor, and cared for those sickened by the plague. She worked to reconcile Italian city states and the Pope. She also wrote The Dialogue, a description of the spiritual life through conversations between God and the soul. She and St Francis of Assisi are co-patrons of Italy, and in 1970 she was named a Doctor of the Church.

**LIFE, JUSTICE, AND PEACE**  
Stations of the Cross for Ukraine

NOTE: These reflections may not be suitable for children.

God of Peace, in Lent you draw us together to witness the depth of your love for us. Allow that love now to intercede in the invasion of Ukraine. Rescue your children. Unite our family. End this war.

**Eighth Station: Jesus Meets the Women of Jerusalem**

**Kateryna, from Lugansk:** These days, I have a feel for what the concept of “sick horror” means. It’s an almost tangible something that lives in the area of the solar plexus. Periodically it spreads its tentacles throughout the body from the inside, compresses every organ, every artery, vein, capillary. It was physically impossible to eat or drink. It was impossible to sleep; it was constantly very cold and no blankets and socks could save us. And I couldn’t cry.

On the second day, fear turned into hellish hatred. It grows stronger every day and becomes almost tangible.

**Ninth Station: Jesus Falls the Third Time**

**Darla, from Mariupol [a child]:** We have been without water, electricity, gas, heating for eight days. Neighbors lit a fire under the house to cook food on. We stood in line for six hours. There was no bread. Shops have been looted. All the roads around are mined by the Russian military. There are no corridors. It’s not safe to drive because you can get blown up.

Mom said there was enough food for everyone for a maximum of a week. After that, there will be no more. They collect snow and boil it.

**Lord, give us the faithfulness to not look away.**



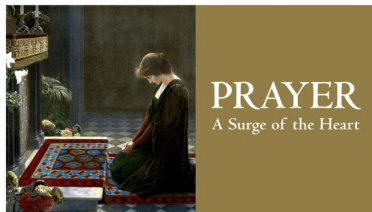

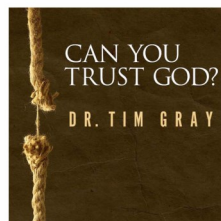
