

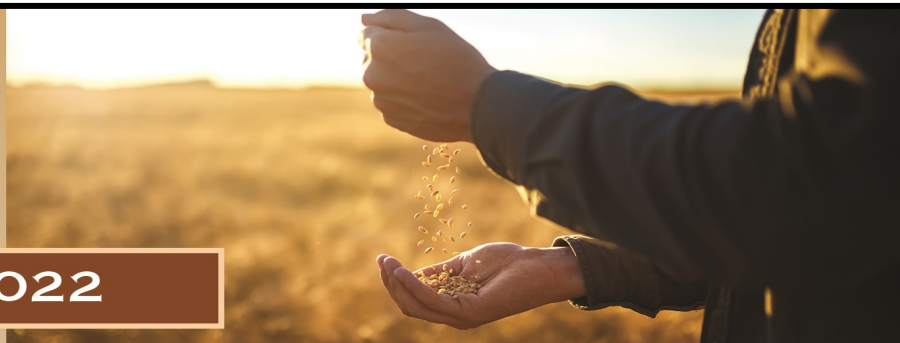

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It's high summer now, school is out, the pace of work slows, and some people drift away. There are visitors in the churches every summer, and familiar faces are "among the missing." Some find the summer's call more appealing than the summons of the church bells. Many, however, would not dream of missing a Sunday, and so they make their way to Mass in unfamiliar places, watching the locals for clues as to when to sit or stand, where the Communion stations are. In answering the call, they keep the "sabbatical" rhythm of the Christian life: every seventh day, the Body of Christ assembles for worship.

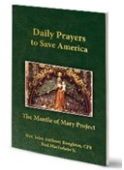
For centuries, there was no obligation to Sunday Mass in the sense of a written law, but Christians have always yearned to be together on Sunday. In the city of Abitina, during a persecution by the Emperor Diocletian, a group of Christians were urged to stop worshipping together on Sundays. They responded, "Then take our lives, for without the Sunday we cannot live." By a curious coincidence, the appointed readings today center us on thoughts of peace. On our Independence Day, the experience of worship situates us in community, and evokes a commitment from us to be advocates of peace in all aspects of our society's life.

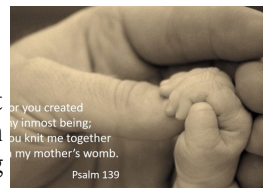
CELEBRATING THE SAINTS



ST OLIVER PLUNKETT (1629 - 1681), born in Ireland, was ordained a Priest and became a professor of theology. In 1669 he was appointed Archbishop of Armagh. In 1678 he was falsely accused of being part of a conspiracy to assassinate King Charles II, and was arrested and taken to England. In a trial that was denounced as a mockery, he was sentenced to death for treason and “promoting the Roman faith.” Although certainly guilty of the latter charge by virtue of being Archbishop, there was no evidence linking him to the conspiracy. He was executed in 1681.

Canonized by St Paul VI in 1975,
His Feast Day is July 2nd

**LIFE, JUSTICE, AND PEACE
US Supreme Court Abortion Ruling**



On June 24th the Supreme Court issued its decision in **Dobbs v Jackson Women’s Health**, the case challenging a Mississippi law that bans abortions after 15 weeks. The Court **overturned Roe v Wade**, the Court’s 1973 decision legalizing abortion, and upheld the Mississippi law. As a result, there is no longer a constitutional right to an abortion:

“We hold that Roe and Casey must be overruled. The Constitution makes no reference to abortion, and no such right is implicitly protected in any constitutional provision...”.

From USCCB Statement on Dobbs

We thank God today that the Court has now overturned this decision. We pray that our elected officials will now **enact laws and policies that promote and protect the most vulnerable among us.**

Our first thoughts are with the little ones whose lives have been taken since 1973. Our hearts are also with every woman and man who has suffered grievously from abortion. **We pray for their healing, and we pledge our continued compassion and support.** As a Church, we need to serve those who face difficult pregnancies and surround them with love.

[This] is a **time for healing wounds and repairing social divisions**; it is a time for reasoned reflection and civil dialogue, and for coming together to build a society and economy that supports marriages and families, and **where every woman has the support and resources she needs to bring her child into this world in love.**

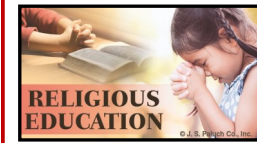

GOOD NEWS IS ON THE WAY

This week, in the midst of summer, the scriptures greet us with joy, peace, mercy, and more peace! Sounds a little like Advent, doesn't it? We often associate the prophet Isaiah with that preparatory season, and our first reading rings with such words as exult, comfort, and rejoice. The Israelites had reason to rejoice, for they had returned, come home, to a rebuilt Jerusalem from their exile in Babylon.

In the Gospel, the seventy-two disciples who were sent out have their own "homecoming," returning to Jesus from spreading the Good News of the Kingdom and preparing people for the "advent" of Jesus into their cities and towns on his long road to Jerusalem. Like the exiles in Isaiah, the disciples return rejoicing.

The Good News, the Kingdom of God, is coming, even in summer. As today's psalm reminds us, "Shout joyfully to God, all the earth!"

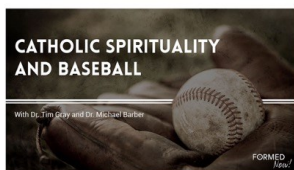
JOHN PAUL II IN AMERICA: UNITING A CONTINENT

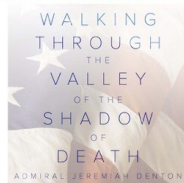
